FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

We've had some changes in my family this year already. On January 3rd, we welcomed a fluffy black ball of energy and teeth into our home. This puppy (we call him Sully), has certainly made life interesting. For one thing, we are getting more exercise walking him around the yard and running in the house to fish out of his mouth whatever non-edible thing he could reach. And then there is the puppy biting. Living with a puppy who is teething is a lot like what I imagine it would be like to live with a genetically engineered combination of a wolf and velociraptor.

My plan for Sully before he even arrived in our lives was for him to train to be a ministry dog. This is a dog who has passed all of the certifications and can accompany me to rehab hospital visits and can be in the church as a comforting presence for people. I needed him to be smart and friendly. Sully, however, is smart and terrified of everything and everyone except me. This is frustrating. I really wanted him to enjoy being around a lot of people not hiding behind me. I've been following the suggestions of a dog behaviorist to help him socialize but it is a long, slow process. He came to church with me and hid under my chair. It seems like a lost cause.

Then I remembered something about Sully and something about all of us. What we are is not what we shall be.

For Sully, that means, with enough time and training, he might become more social and acclimated to the world. I shouldn't toss out his potential just because he isn't where I expected him to be at 17 weeks old. For us, it means we shouldn't toss out our potential just because we aren't where we expected to be at our age. For all of us, each day brings new opportunities for growth and learning. For all of us, each day brings an opportunity to develop or deepen relationships. For all of us, each day gives us the gift of becoming something more than we were when we went to sleep.

Perhaps it is easier to see the potential for change and growth in a puppy than in an adult human but it is there all the same. What a blessing.


PREPARING FOR EASTER STUDY GROUP


Wednesdays at 10:00am Beginning March 4th

Sunday, February 2nd Is Millis Fund Sunday!

The Millis Fund helps Millis families with temporary financial emergencies by paying bills directly to creditors. Applications for assistance are reviewed and evaluated by a nine-member Operating Board of Millis citizens. Three Millis churches including ours, Saint Thomas, Saint Paul's, Ael-Chunon Congregation, and a generous Millis business gave founding donations in 1993.

Please consider making a generous contribution to the Millis Fund on or around "Super Sunday", February 2nd. You can donate by placing a check or cash in one of the specially marked envelopes available at worship; in one of the "pots" placed by our sanctuary entrances; or by sending a check made to The Millis Fund to the church office any time. Did you know that:

- The Millis Fund has helped more than 400 Millis families cope with financial emergencies since its founding.
- 99% of funds collected by the Millis Fund go directly to aid families rather than to administrative costs.
- The Fund is administered by an ALL VOLUNTEER OPERATING BOARD of Millis citizens, including three from our Church.
- Your donation is tax deductible for 2020 under IRS Code 501(C)(3). The Millis Fund's Tax Identification Number is 04-3228631.
- If your employer matches charitable contributions, the Millis Fund may qualify to be included. Please consider applying for this match if it's available to you.

The Missions Committee has responded to the recent global disasters by making donations directly to the following Charity Navigator 4-star non-profit organizations:

- **GlobalGiving Project** # **44385** will go directly to support the Australian Wildfire project that initially aids First Responders in search and rescue operations and aids survivors' urgent needs for shelter, medical care, food, and clean water. After initial work, they assist in long term recovery efforts led by vetted local organizations.
- The Hispanic Federation- Puerto Rico Relief and Recovery has had a team in place since the hurricanes in 2007. They provide emergency funds for local health and human service providers working in affected communities. They have also partnered with Puerto Rico University to provide Mental Health services.

South Shore Habitat for Humanity update- The house build in Easton is planned to begin in March. Once we know of available dates we will be organizing volunteers for a group build.

New Life Furniture Bank of MA in Walpole is one of our ongoing local non-profits we support as a church.
