Required Safety Protocols for Outdoor Worship Services

The back lawn will be marked off, to allow for safe distancing for participants. Please arrive early so you have enough time to check-in and set-up your chair or blanket.

Ushers will seat you in pre-measured spaces for appropriate distancing.

In order to ensure a safe experience for everyone, please follow these protocols:

- Stay home if you have any signs of infection, i.e. fever, cough, loss of smell/taste, scratchy throat or if you feel ill.
- A mask or other face covering must be worn at all times by everyone over the age of two. Masks for children ages 2-5 are at the discretion of parents.
- We will have hand sanitizer available.
- Bring your own chair or blanket to sit on.
- All participants must check-in and provide contact information prior to the service. Bringing a note with you with your names and phone or email will speed this process.
- We encourage you to use your home bathroom before arriving for services. Restrooms will be open if needed.
- The rest of the building will be closed.
- Liturgies will be available on the church website and in the Friday email, so you can print at home and bring it with you, or follow along on your phone/tablet. No printed materials will be provided at the time of the service.
- You may hum or mouth the words during hymns. There will be no singing by the congregation.
- Please bring your pledges and offerings. A dropoff basket will be provided at the service. You can also mail in your donation to the church.
- Please stay at least 6 feet apart at all times.

Sanctuary Is Open for Prayer Wednesdays from 1-2pm

On Wednesdays from 1-2pm, the sanctuary will be open for prayer and quiet reflection.

Masks will be required at all times. Enter through the front doors. Signs will be posted at the church with additional safety protocols.

Notes from the Music Director

How shall we sing the Lord's song in a strange land? Psalm 137 v. 4

In the past few months, this verse has come to mind many times. When I learned that The American Association of Choral Conductors and the UCC had issued a statement advising that choral singing should be deferred until September of 2021, I was heartbroken. The choir has been such an integral part of the life of our church that it seemed unthinkable, but it only took a moment to realize that this was what must be done.

The land, our land, does seem strange now. Often we don't recognize each other because we are masked; touching hands and hugging are no longer a part of Sunday morning greetings and services. We are distanced from one another and fearful.

The singing of praise to the Lord has been prominent in the history of the Church from Old Testament times; we sing hymns of worship and praise, of celebration, joy and comfort, but this question is asked in a psalm that speaks of great sorrow. This is a time of sorrow and loss and yet we sing. Our voices are muffled by masks, we do our best to master technology that helps us to include music in our services, and for most of us, we hear but cannot participate. And yet, we sing. We sing in our hearts, old and new hymns and I cannot help but feel that perhaps this isn't the empty attempt I feared. Becki Abalutzk and Deb Hall have recorded the hymns with their beautiful voices. How fortunate we are to have two such gifted musicians! And as they sing, we follow along, we read the words and hear
